A-1 Executive Summary

The IEEE Kansai Section was established in November 1998. As of December 31, 2011, the Kansai Section comprised 2,316 members (see Item B-1). This number is 111 more compared to December 31, 2010.

In 2011 the Section had 5 executive meetings, 1 annual section meeting and 5 technical lectures. In 2012 the Section has already had 1 annual section meeting and two executive meetings.

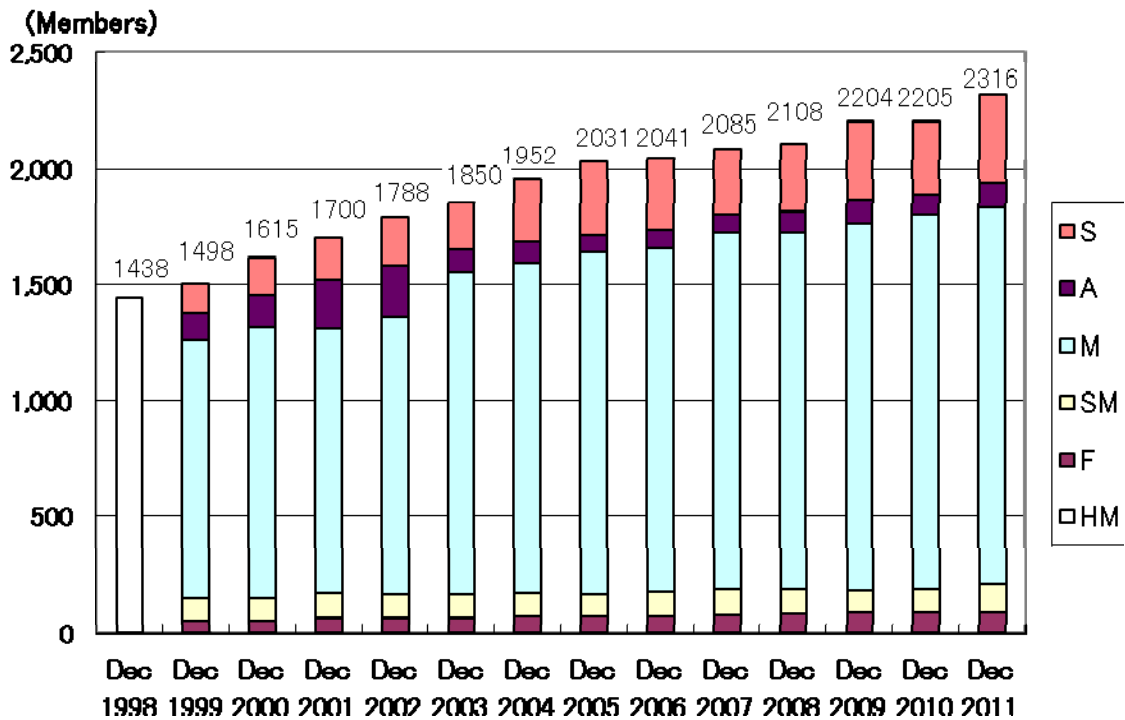

The IEEE Kansai Section Medal is presented to new Senior Members. The medal is designed with a portrait of Gennai Hiraga, who constructed the first friction generator in Japan, called Elekiter. We presented the medals to 12 new Senior Members at the annual section meeting on February 14, 2012.

B-2 Nominations Committee

The Nominations Committee asked Fellow members in the Kansai Section to recommend Fellow upgrade candidates. Five members were endorsed from the Kansai Section, resulting in two new Fellows in the Kansai Section. We sent e-mails to all Senior Members to inform the procedure for Fellow membership.

B-3 Student Activities Committee

The Student Activities Committee planned the Kansai Section Student Paper Award to encourage student members of the Kansai Section in their research activities of presenting

excellent papers at IEEE international conferences and in IEEE Transactions. In cooperation with the Awards Committee, we selected 12 award winners in 2011.

The Kansai Section has six student branches: Osaka University, Kyoto University, Ritsumeikan University, NAIST (Nara Institute of Science and Technology), the University of Hyogo, and Kansai University. Additionally, one more branch is planned to be built. These branches held a Student Branch Contact Meeting in December 2011 at Kyoto University as done in the past. The Student Branch of Ritsumeikan University held its annual English Presentation Competition in October 2011. A total of 22 reports and about 60 attendees joined from 4 student branches of the Kansai Section. The Student Activities Committee awarded excellent presenters with certificates of merit.

Furthermore, we held joint meetings with the Membership Development Committee and provided activity support for GOLD Award members and female members.

B-4 Awards Committee

The Awards Committee established the IEEE Kansai Section GOLD Award in 2001. Since 2009, this award is presented not only to students or younger researchers, but also to younger corporate engineers who contribute to IEEE Kansai Section activities. The 2011 Kansai Section GOLD Award was presented at the annual section meeting on February 14, 2012, to Mr. Hidekazu Umeda (Panasonic Corp.) and Mr. Takashi Yamamoto (Kyoto University).
